## Cross Pointe Children's Ministry Vision

Here at Cross Pointe Church, we teach Truth, Life, and Ministry. These are our key values as a church and in our Children's Ministry for our children.

#### TRUTH: Teach the Word of God Fully

Our goal as a Children's Ministry is to teach our children the Word of God unapologetically. We strive to choose a curriculum that dives deep into the Word and doesn't just skim the surface.

#### <u>LIFE</u>: Teach kids how to apply the Bible practically to their lives

We strive to teach our children in a way where they can practically apply what they have learned to their own lives.

#### MINISTRY: Teach kids to value serving and growing in the church

We don't want our children to be lost once they grow out of children's programming. We aim to give the older children opportunities to volunteer and serve in our church so that they know they are a vital part of the church body as a whole.



What is BLAST? BLAST is our Wednesday night program for kids ages 3- 12<sup>th</sup> grade here at Cross Pointe Church. On Wednesday nights we meet from 6:00-7:45 PM. BLAST Kids is for kids ages 3-5<sup>th</sup> grade, Trailblazers, our Middle School Youth Group, is for youth in 6<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grades, and Kingdom Builders, our High School Youth Group, is for youth in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades.

At BLAST Kids, we offer a nursery and 8 children's classes. A typical night at BLAST Kids includes a lesson from the Bible, games, and music (worship). The Poppers, our 3-year-old class, uses the Awana Puggles curriculum, while the rest of our classes use the Answers in Genesis Bible Curriculum. Our preschool class focuses on the gospel and the life of Jesus, and our K-5<sup>th</sup> grade children will study the Bible from Genesis to Revelation.

#### **BLAST** Classes

We have eight classes at BLAST, split by the child's age and grade. Each class also has a class color. Children are encouraged to wear the class t-shirt, or a shirt the color of their class. BLAST t-shirts are available to order in the online registration.

Poppers (green) - 3-year-olds (and 2-year-olds of volunteers) Stars (blue) - 4-year-olds and 5-year-olds who are not yet in kindergarten. Meteors (purple) - Kindergarten Rockets (red) - 1st Grade Novas (yellow) - 2nd Grade Comets (orange) - 3rd Grade Asteroids (navy blue) - 4th Grade Jets (black) - 5th Grade

Each BLAST class has one or more teachers and at least one assistant. We have separate volunteers for games and music.

Children are placed in their class in September based on their current age or grade they will be entering. They will remain in that class for the duration of the BLAST year. The Pre-Kindergarten class is based on the year the child will start kindergarten. The **Stars** class is for children starting kindergarten next school year. **Poppers** is for children who will be in kindergarten in two years or are the 2-year-olds of the BLAST volunteers.

registration form. Please add childrens.ministry@cp-church.org to your address book; otherwise, the email may go to your junk folder. You will also receive monthly emails from this address for Children's Ministry.

## **BLAST Meals**

A BLAST meal will be offered on the first Wednesday of each month, September through April, at 5:30 p.m. The recommended donation is \$3 per child, \$5 per adult, or \$20 per family. Gluten-free options will be available upon request. We would appreciate it if you RSVP for these meals in advance. BLAST Newsletter emails will be sent each month with an opportunity to RSVP or use the sign-up in the Church Center App.

## Theme Nights

Throughout the year, BLAST has theme nights. On these nights, the children can dress up according to the theme. Some of these nights will also have special lessons, like Thanksgiving and Christmas.

## **Mission Moments**

We have different *Mission Moments* on our calendar throughout the year. The BLAST students will have an opportunity to serve others through prayer and giving. We will announce the mission and explain it to the children during BLAST. For some Mission Moments, we may present a challenge between the children to bring items for the organization. If the children meet the challenge, they will receive a prize. Please see the BLAST calendar for specific dates.

#### **BLAST** Points

The children have several opportunities to earn points throughout the year. These points can be spent at two BLAST stores, which will be open each January and April. The classroom teachers will be in charge of recording points for each child. Points can be earned in the following ways:

- Attendance 5 points per night
- Bring Bible 5 points per night
- Wear BLAST shirt (or class color) 5 points per night
- Participate in theme night (See BLAST calendar) 5 points
- Completed take-home or sermon notes (detailed below) 15 points per week
- Memorize an assigned Bible Verse 20 points
- Bring a Friend 20 points

## Memory Verses

Each class has a first, second, and third list of memory verses. All classes start with the first verse sheet at the beginning of the year. Please work with your children on these verses at home, as they will not spend much time on them in class. When your child is ready with a verse, they can recite it to their teacher during class time. BLAST verse sheets are available to download on our website

At the end of the year, at the BLAST Closing Celebration, medals and trophies will be awarded as follows:

- Memory Verse Medal Complete 1<sup>st</sup> Memory Verse Sheet
- Memory Verse Trophy & Pizza party Complete the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2ns Memory Verse Sheet
- Memory Verse Champion Trophy Complete the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, & 3<sup>rd</sup> Memory Verse Sheets and

Recite the 3rd Memory Verse Sheet at one time to an elder, deacon, or pastor.



#### Take-Home Sheets

Each week, your child will receive a take-home sheet to complete at home and bring back. If they bring it back to class, completed, they will receive points. This will take some parent involvement depending on the child's age. For  $4^{th}$  and  $5^{th}$  grade, they must turn in their class notes as part of their homework. If they only did one or the other, it is then only half the points. At the BLAST Closing Celebration, students who turn in 90% of their homework, will be awarded a Homework Medal.

#### Sermon Notes

Third through fifth grade students who attend the main service on Sunday mornings can also earn points by filling out "Sermon Notes for Kids," getting a parent signature, signifying they discussed the notes/sermon with their children, and turning it into their teacher on Wednesday night.

## **BLAST Newsletter Emails**

BLAST Newsletter Emails will be sent out at the beginning of each month. It will contain information about upcoming events and an RSVP for the BLAST Meals. The email will be sent to the email address you provided on the registration form. Please add childrens.ministry@cp-church.org to your address book otherwise the email may go to your junk folder. In addition, if BLAST is cancelled due to weather or another reason, an email will be sent to the email address provided on the registration form.

## Child Drop Off/Pick Up and Check-In

- Upon arrival, each child must be checked in at the check-in station with their parents. As they check in, a nametag is printed out for each child. Please have the child wear their nametag throughout the night. The child's nametag has their parent's phone number on it in case of emergency, and a code for the parent to use for picking up their children.
- The parent at the same time receives a printed tag with a code that matches the code on their child's nametag. This printed tag with the code must be shown to the teacher for the child to be released from the classroom. Please do not enter the classroom when picking up your child.
- Children will be dropped off and picked up at their classrooms.
- Security and medical persons are on-site during BLAST.

Note: This handbook is a guideline for policies and procedures. The Children's Education Committee and the Elders of Cross Pointe Church reserve the right to change any of these policies at any time without notice if deemed necessary. This document is not legally binding.

#### **Behavior** Policy

Children are expected to treat their teachers and classmates with respect and listen to instruction always.

If discipline is needed, BLAST leaders will use the following steps:

- Step 1: Classroom teacher will talk to the child about the behavior.
- Step 2: If misbehavior and disobedience continues, the child will be separated from his/her class, in a common area, to speak with a different leader.
  - a. Leader will assertively, and calmly speak to the child about his/her behavior.
  - b. Leader will explain that the Bible tells us we must submit to authority, for all authority comes from God. Those who rebel against authority are rebelling against what God has instituted (explain in age-appropriate terms).
  - c. Leader will encourage student to pray and repent.
  - d. Student will be brought back to class.
- Step 3: Upon the third offence, parents will be called, and they must pick up their child as soon as possible. Parents and BLAST teacher will discuss behavior.

#### Poppers & Stars Bathroom Policy

Parents are encouraged to take their children to the bathroom before class and send them to class wearing bottoms that are simple for the child to take on and off. If a child cannot use the bathroom independently, the parents are to stay in the building the entire evening and a text will be sent if needed. If they cannot do this, their child should not go to class until he is ready to use the bathroom without assistance.

When a child needs to use the restroom, two adults must be present. The bathroom door should remain open, and the adults should assist as little as possible. Provide a stool if needed. Adults must not wipe a child or pull up pants or underpants.

#### Kindergarten-5<sup>th</sup> Grade Bathroom Policy

There will be one group bathroom break each evening using the following protocol below.

Children will stand in line outside of the bathrooms.

Before allowing any child to enter, two adults will check the bathrooms (male check male, female check female) to make sure they are empty.

One male adult should stand at the male bathroom door, and the female adult at the female bathroom door. They should leave the main doors open and allow the appropriate number of children in at a time to use the restroom. This number will be based on the number of toilets/urinals.

In the case of a bathroom "emergency," and a child needs to use the restroom outside of the regular group bathroom break time, two adults must be present, and stand outside the bathroom door.

#### Security

- Security and medical persons are on-site during BLAST.
- A volunteer is never left alone with a child.

## Well-Child Policy

We ask that children be kept at home with any of the following symptoms and/or illnesses. We appreciate your cooperation.

- Fever (must be fever-free 24 hours without medication)
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Runny Nose (excessive or discolored)
- Persistent Cough
- Strep Throat
- Sore Throat
- Active Chicken Pox
- Measles
- Mumps
- Unexplained or Contagious Rash

- Conjunctivitis (Pink Eye)
- Fifths Disease
- Impetigo
- Hand, Foot, and Mouth Disease
- Lice (Children should not attend until after treatment, and all live lice and visible nits have been removed).
- COVID-19 diagnosis, close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19, or a suspected COVID-19 illness in your family

If a child is being treated with antibiotics, he/she should be on the medication for 24 hours before attending classes.

If a child develops any of the above symptoms while in our care, we will call and ask you to come get him/her. If you notice your child has an illness after attending our classes, please notify <u>childrens.ministry@cp-church.org</u> or 763-843-2271. Thank you for helping us avoid the spread of illness and helping keep the children and volunteers at Cross Pointe Church healthy.

#### Modesty Guidelines

Each night at BLAST, volunteers and children should dress in a manner that brings honor to God. On Theme Nights and Holiday Celebrations, when costumes or other clothing can be worn, please consider this as well.
